

Experience is shaped by environment


Expression affirms one's own experience






Aesthetics is not individualism but a collective encounter with history

When following a practice, what kind of knowledge and power structures are being reproduced?

Avoid perpetuation of colonial vestiges to further generational trauma – desist and resist epistemic violence

Universalism can be complicit naïveté

Apply critical theory and cultural studies to library resources, services and spaces - decolonisation
